



ABOUT THE PLACE

Also known by the foundational name of “Villa de San Cristóbal de la Havana”, and nicknamed later as “The key of the New World” and “The City of Columns” (by the Cuban writer Alejo Carpentier). It was founded on 16th of November 1519 by the Spanish conqueror Diego Velázquez de Cuéllar as one of the first seven villages of Cuba. With the passing of time it acquired great strategic importance for the Spanish Crown becoming the epicenter of trade in the Americas and gathering point of the fleets going from the New World to Europe. Its historical center was declared by UNESCO as World Heritage Site in 1982.

Touring Havana
